Devotions

I think as Christians we tend to look at singleness like it is something to feel bad about or to pity.

When you are single you can at times look at married couples and long for what they have; companionship and someone to love.

This is not necessarily wrong but let us look at three godly single women from the Word to help improve our vision of singleness; one who was divorced, one who was widowed, and one who was single.

Each one of these women is remembered not for her singleness! Rather each one is remembered for her willingness to be singled out for God!

“For whatever period of time I am single, by God's grace I will be totally His in body, soul, and spirit. I will claim no time, aspirations or interests of my own and will seek only to please Him. And as a single woman, I will pursue those same qualities that God values in a wife and mother - a gentle, quiet, serving, submissive, trusting spirit.

If God's plan for me is to become a wife and mother, then I will wait patiently, without fretting, until God reveals the husband of His choice. In the meantime, however, marriage cannot be my pursuit. I must pursue Him (Ps. 62:5 - My soul, wait silently for God alone, For my expectation is from Him.)”
