Friday Evening | Read Daniel Chapter 1

Read verse 8 once again.

To purpose means: an intended or desired result, end, aim or goal. Have you purposed in your heart not to be defiled with the world delicacies? Is it your aim? Is it your goal? Is He on the throne of your heart or has the circumstances of life and ministry removed Him from that rightful place? Is your gaze Heavenward or earthbound? Oh, how we need to have our hearts continually prepared, purposed, and preserved for God!

Read Psalm 62:5-6

Write these verses out and lay your heart before God in prayer.

Saturday Morning | Read Daniel 3:8-30

Write down what speaks to you through these verses.

What comes to mind when you hear the word worship or devotion? What are you truly devoted to?

Devoted is defined as: loyal, faithful, true, steadfast, constant, committed, devout, fond, and loving.

Once again read verses 17 and 18; read verse 28.

Think on this and lay your heart before God in prayer.

Saturday Evening | Read Daniel 6:10-28

Read verse 10 once again.

What does it say of Daniel in the last part of this verse? Oh how we must persevere in prayer! Bowed down before God must be the place where we most naturally find ourselves when life and ministry press in on us!

In verse 23; it says of Daniel "because he believed in his God."
Are you assured of God's promises? Have you embraced them?
Do you believe in your God? Do you hope in His word?
Read the declaration of King Darius in verses 26-27.
Think on this and lay your heart before God in prayer.
